IMPORTANT NOTE:

This is a position dependent on grant funding from Young Canada Works and Canada Summer Jobs. Applicants must fit the criteria of the Young Canada Works Program and the Canada Summer Jobs Program. To be eligible for YCW and CSJ, individuals must be a current student or recent graduate who must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident, or have refugee status in Canada
- Note: Non-Canadian students holding temporary work visas or awaiting permanent status are not eligible
- Be legally entitled to work in Canada
- Be between 16 and 30 years of age at the start of employment
- Meet the specific eligibility criteria of the program for which you apply
- Be registered in the YCW online candidate inventory
- Be willing to commit to the full duration of the work assignment
- Not have another full-time job (over 30 hours a week) while employed with YCW.

Although there is public transport within town, a car would be beneficial to the applicant if they are moving to the area for the summer.

This position pays \$18 an hour and will be five days a week, 35 hours/week.
